December I think is like fattening up the Turkey with Christmas lunch at head office and Party night at Ullesthorpe Court Golf club for more food and a knees up!!

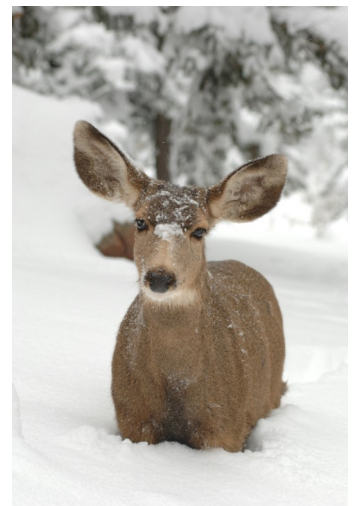
As you can see its been a full packed 2024, with such a great thriving club , great friendly members , and what we can achieve with your help, 2025 can only get better.

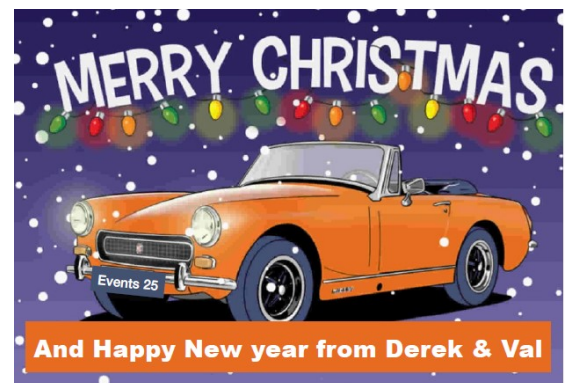

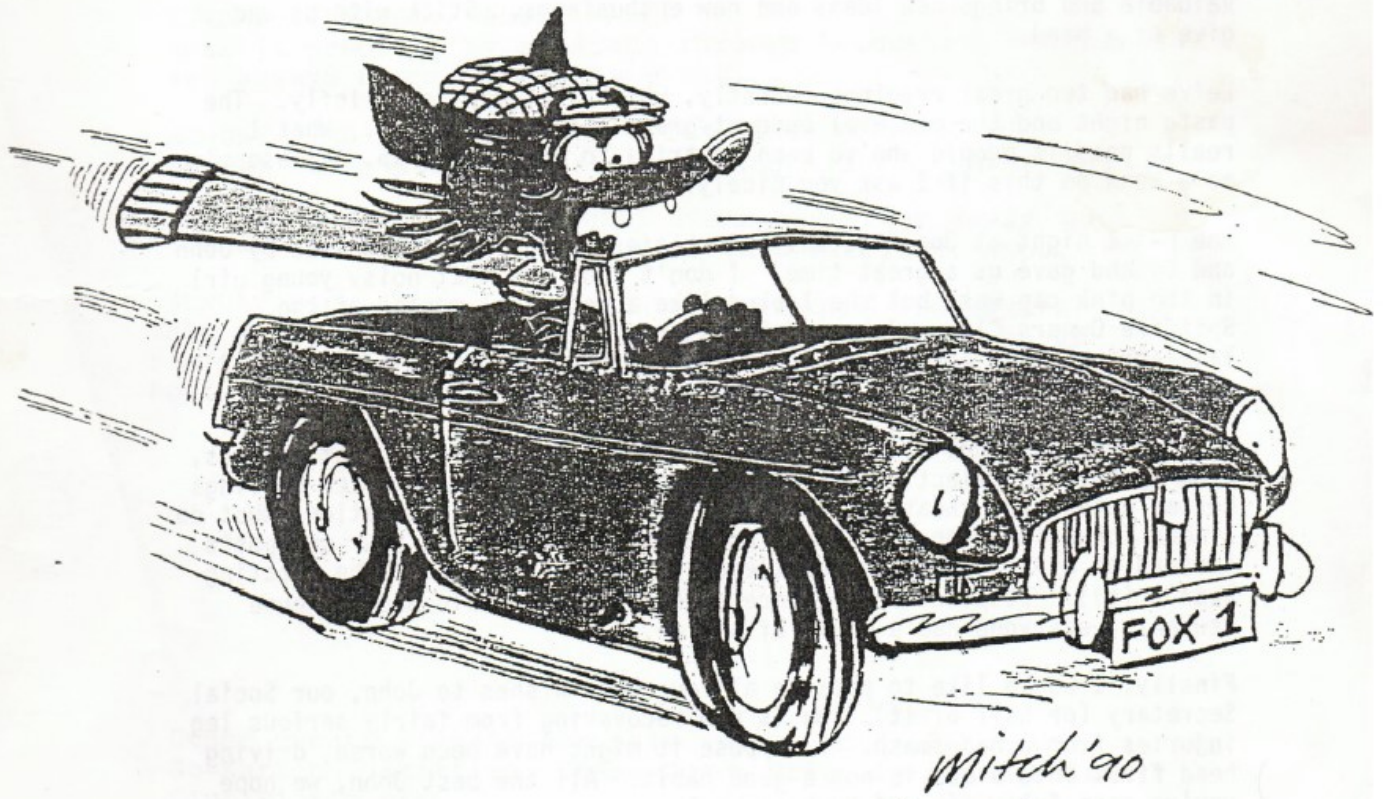

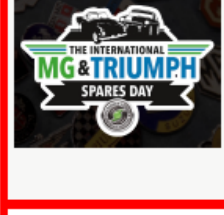
