
Peter Geisler and Dave Taylors visit to Isle of Man.

I'm a fairly new owner of an M.G. even though they've been in my family on and off since I was 12. In March 1990 armed with a very limited budget I set off to buy myself a new toy. I could afford a half way decent Rubber Bumper Midget if the right one turned up. To my surprise I ended up with a decent looking Round Wheel Arch complete with factory hard-top, spare engine and gearbox! Little did I know how much I would need those extras. The previous owner had fitted a fast-road cam + performance manifold and assured me all it needed was a Spring tune. To cut a long story short, "The Colonel's" modifications were a bag of ****, the clutch was almost non-existent, the steering rack was accident damaged shock absorbers shot and a world record depth of underseal covered a floor made of brown lace!

NOTIFICATION OF COMPULSORY ENLISTMENT

On behalf of Her Majesty the Queen and her Government, you are hereby notified under the Emergency Powers Act, 1939 (as amended by the Defence Act, 1978) that you are required to place yourself on standby for possible compulsory military service in the Gulf conflict. You may shortly be given order to report within 48 hours for service with our forces currently stationed in Saudi Arabia. You have been assigned to the Third Battalion, Queens Own Reserves.

The route without bumps was chosen though.






